Farmer's Market Vouchers...

- Registration will start on Monday, May 5th and will continue until all available vouchers have been assigned;
- The ADRC phone lines are staffed Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Callers must speak with an ADRC staff member to complete enrollment. The ADRC can be reached at (253) 798-4600 or (800) 562-0332;
- Callers should be prepared to provide their total household size and total household income when they call. This information is required to determine eligibility;

They will have 8 pick-up dates at 7 different locations throughout the County. Please see the flyer posted at the center for all the details on the site locations and pick-up days.

Eligibility criteria for participation in the Senior Farmers Market program is as follows:

 \cdot Participants must be 60 years of age or older at the time that they pick up their vouchers, Native Americans and Alaska Natives must be 55 years of age or older;

· Participants must have income at or below 185% of the Federal Poverty Level based upon their household size

o \$1,799 per month for a single-person household

o \$2,425 per month for a two-person household

o \$3,051 per month for a three-person household

 \cdot Participants must present a valid form of photo identification when they come to pick up their voucher.

· Participants must be residents of Pierce County;

 \cdot Participants must be able to come to the voucher distribution site in person on their assigned pick-up day. There will be no distribution via affidavit.



FREE Dental Cleanings for Seniors at MCCC!

Our next clinic has been re-scheduled for June 11th!

To be eligible to receive free services, clients must:

· Be 60 years of age or older

• Have household income less than 200% of the FPL (\$1, 915 per month for a single person household, \$2,585 for a two-person household-ADRC staff will help callers walk through this piece)

• Have no dental coverage

· Have had no dental care in the past 24 months

Call the ADRC at (253)798-4600 to register for this wonderful FREE program! This funding may not be available next year, so sign-up FAST!!!

Tamara Shearer is a Registered Dental Hygienist who has received certification from the Washington State Department of Health to offer oral exams and cleaning services to older adults at senior centers and long-term care facilities. She will assess each client's overall oral health, and depending upon the client's needs, will administer a basic cleaning or a deep cleaning, including administration of fluoride treatments. She may also make recommendations for additional treatment and care. Tamara is not allowed to administer anesthesia, or perform any type of invasive procedure such as filling cavities or extracting teeth.

To sign up for the service, clients should call the ADRC at (253) 798-4600. When they call, they will be asked to provide their contact information, DOB, confirm that they do not have dental insurance and have not received any dental care for the past 24 months, and they will be asked to provide their monthly household income. All callers must also provide the name and contact information of their primary care physician. Ms. Shearer is required to obtain physician consent to perform the dental cleaning. With the caller's permission, she can fax the physician consent form directly to the doctor's office. She can also mail the form to the caller and they can take the form to the physician's office themselves, but this may slow down the process.
